What is the HEVO Programme

The Higher Education Volleyball Officer (HEVO)

Programme is a volunteer initiative that sees students take up official ambassador roles and deliver recreational volleyball at their university during the academic year, with support from Volleyball England.



Role of a Senior HEVO



The role of a Senior HEVO is to act as an extension of Volleyball England to support the HEVOs and develop the programme.



- Be proactive in supportive tutors and VE Staff as required at the HEVO conference.
- Provide support, mentorship, and development opportunities to regional HEVOs.
- Collaborate with regional associations and/ or local club committees to understand gaps and grow volleyball in the region.
- Maintain consistent communication with Volleyball England.
